

DAYS 1-2 DISCOVER EDINBURGH



The porcelain industry in Limoges is now regarded as the best in the world. The nearby village of Oradour-sur-Glane has often been referred to as one of the most powerful WWII sites in France, having been the location of one of the worst Nazi atrocities on French soil. The abandoned village sits stuck in time, left exactly as it was on that dark day.

Leaving Amiens, you return to Paris, return your motorhome, and then transfer from the depot to your Paris airport hotel.

DAY 28 HEADING HOME

Sadly, your journey ends today and you will be transferred to the airport to connect with your onward flight.

The Rocky Mountains are home to ice-capped peaks and vast glaciers in Alberta and British Columbia. Keep your eyes peeled for the indigenous wildlife, including bears, wolves, moose and coyotes. You will experience pristine blue lakes, alpine meadows, and the beautiful resorts of Banff, Jasper and Whistler. DAYS 1-2 CALGARY

Calgary has a rich western heritage as Canada's 'Cowtown' We recommend taking in the views from the Calgary Tower Observation Deck or stepping back in time at the Heritage Park Historical Village.

DAYS 3-5 BANFF

On day three, you'll pick up your RV and begin your journey with the drive to Banff. Located in the heart of the Rocky Mountains, you'll be able to explore Banff and its surroundings at your leisure. You'll have plenty of time to see the sights, including Lake Minnewanka, the Vermilion Lakes and Johnston Canyon. Sulphur Mountain is worth a visit, and here you can dip in the hot pools or take the gondola to the top of the mountain.

DAYS 6-7 JASPER

The Icefields Parkway is often considered the world's most spectacular road. Running 230km from Lake Louise to Jasper, it features the best of Rocky Mountain scenery, with cascading rivers, high mountain passes, alpine glaciers, snowy peaks and crystal clear turquoise lakes. Along the way keep an eye out for black bears, deer and coyotes. Stop whenever you can and drink in the views – highlights include the Crowfoot Glacier, Peyto Lake and Lake Louise. Jasper National Park is jaw droppingly wild and beautiful.

DAYS 8-9 WELLS GRAY NATIONAL PARK

The Yellowhead Highway leads you through Mount Robson Provincial Park, home of the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies. Continue through the high jagged peaks and glaciers of the Cariboo Mountains to Clearwater, then on to Wells Gray Provincial Park. Immerse vourself in the natural surroundings. The wildlife found here is exceptional and includes grizzlies, moose, caribou, wolves and cougars. Don't miss Dawson and Spahats Falls and especially Helmcken Falls, which plunges 140 metres down into a mistfilled abyss which, in winter, freezes into a pinnacle of ice.

DAYS 10-11 SUN PEAKS

Continue south along Highway 5 today following the North Thompson River. Sun Peaks is Canada's second largest ski area and during the summer its lifts transport you up to spectacular views and stunning hiking and biking trails. In addition there are golf courses, spas and riding stables to keep you busy.

DAYS 12 CACHE CREEK

The craggy peaks give way to desertlike terrain as you approach Kamloops, once a stopping point for fur traders and frontiersmen. On to Cache Creek, also built on the fur trade and gold digging. Some say the town took its name when travellers hid their gold 'cache' along the riverbanks, others say it was merely a storage facility for furs and supplies. The Historic Hat Creek Ranch is a popular visit, allowing an insight into life during the Gold Rush days.

DAYS 13-14 WHISTLER

Drive up through the stunning Coastal Mountains heading to Whistler today. Be sure to pause for sensational views, none more so than at Duffey and Joffre Lakes. Whistler is known for world class skiing, but summer is a great time to visit this gorgeous town amid its mountainous alpine surroundings. Take the Peak 2 Peak Gondola for a bird's eye view of the amazing mountain scenery with magnificent hiking and biking trails laced across the slopes.

DAYS 15-16 VANCOUVER

A day for unforgettable, spectacular views along Highway 99 to Vancouver. The scenic Sea to Sky Highway runs along the shores of the Pacific Ocean and there are plenty of sights along the way. Aside from the Sea to Sky Gondola at Squamish, a cable car which takes you 7.5 km up for 360° views, there are beautiful waterfalls, hiking trails, craft breweries and amazing seascapes. The Capilano Suspension Bridge and Grouse Mountain, both just outside Vancouver, are amazing. Take a full day to get to know Vancouver, taking in Chinatown, Gastown and Granville Island Public Market. Perhaps hire bikes and cycle around Stanley Park.

DAYS 17-18 OKANAGAN VALLEY

Cruise along the Crowsnest Pass (Highway 3) today all the way east to the British Columbia-Alberta border in the Rockies. Stop and stroll among the hills and valleys of beautiful Manning Park with its crashing rivers and serene meadows. Visit Oliver, the wine capital of Canada, to take a winery tour. Discover the best of Canadian wines and, of course, enjoy a tasting or pick up a sample of two.

DAYS 19-20 REVELSTOKE

Take to the friendly streets on foot or catch a hop-on/hop-off bus, maybe stopping off at Canada Place, Jack Pool Plaza and Stanley Park where you can hire bikes and pedal through the temperate rainforest and the adjoining 8 km seawall.

DAYS 4-5 VICTORIA

Collect your motorhome and catch the ferry heading across the Strait of Georgia to Vancouver Island. On the island perhaps stop at Butchart Gardens where you can admire the beautiful flowers and gardens. Take the time to wander around Victoria's inner harbour with the surrounding Parliament Buildings and the Empress Hotel.

DAY 6 NANAIMO

Cruising along Malahat Drive you'll enjoy the mesmerizing views out over the Pacific. Coombs is a popular option, famous for its country market known locally as 'the Goats on the Roof' for the goats which graze on its grassy roof.

DAYS 7-8 UCLUELET

Weave through the timeless Douglas fir trees of the stately Cathedral Grove or stroll along the beach to see the ancient stone carvings in the rock face - the petroglyphs are up to 3,000 years old. There's plenty to do from the small village of Ukee. Wildlife abounds and you can go whale watching or bear watching, fishing, surfing, hiking, biking, ocean kayaking or zip lining. Nearby in Tofino you can explore the Pacific Rim and Long Beach.

DAY 9 PARKSVILLE

Heading north up Highway 19A to Parksville, you'll be able to take it easy on the lovely sandy beaches, notably the wondrous shoreline and picture postcard views at Qualicum Beach.

DAYS 10-11 WHISTLER

Return to the mainland by ferry and cruise along the sensational Sea-to-Sky Highway of the Pacific Coast as you make your way to Whistler. Summer is a great time to visit this gorgeous town amid its mountainous alpine surroundings. Take the Peak 2 Peak Gondola for a bird's eye view of the amazing mountain scenery.

DAY 12 LILLOOET

Follow the sensational Duffey Lake Road through the beautiful Coast Mountains, with its combination of volcanic and nonvolcanic peaks as you make your way to Lillooet for an overnight stop.

DAYS 13-14 WELLS GRAY NATIONAL PARK

Today you'll get a real feel for British Columbia's historic gold rush, following stretches of the original Cariboo Wagon Road that was trodden by thousands of pioneers in the 1860s. From there you'll continue through the high jagged peaks and glaciers of the Cariboo Mountains to Clearwater and on to Wells Gray Provincial Park. Immerse yourself in natural surroundings, with pounding waterfalls, guided walks, hiking trails and kayaking.

DAYS 15-16 JASPER

Stop off at the amazing Rearguard Falls before carrying on through Mount Robson Provincial Park, home of the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies. Jasper National Park is jaw-droppingly wild and beautiful, it is immense in every sense, with unique wildlife, vast icefields and desolate expanses. Cruise along Maligne Lake, admire the alpine meadows and Mount Edith Cavell glacier, a carpet of colourful wildflowers in spring.

DAYS 17-18 BANFF

The Icefields Parkway is often considered the world's most spectacular road. Linking Jasper to Lake Louise, it features the best of Rocky Mountain scenery, with cascading rivers, high mountain passes, alpine glaciers and crystal clear turquoise lakes. In Banff we recommend visiting Lake Minnewanka, the Vermillion Lakes, Bow Falls, Johnston Canyon and Sulphur Mountain, plus enjoy a dip in the hot pools.

DAY 19 REVELSTOKE

Cruise along the deep canyons of Kicking Horse Pass and head into Yoho National Park where you'll want to see Wapta Falls and Emerald Lake. Pick up the Trans-Canada Highway and drive through dizzying snow-capped mountains and glaciers en route to Glacier National Park where the surrounding scenery is sensational.

DAYS 20-21 OKANAGAN VALLEY

Driving south beside stunning lakes and through rolling hills you'll reach the picturesque Okanagan Valley, where a milder climate ensures a reputation for fine wines and numerous fruit orchards. Over 60 wineries can be found in the valley, many offering a chance to enjoy a tour and a tasting.

DAYS 22-23 MANNING PROVINCAL PARK

Follow the majestic Crowsnest Highway westwards, with the mountains towering above you on either side. The Cascade Mountains of Manning Provincial Park are home to a range of wildlife including black bear, coyote, marmot, beaver, chipmunks and deer, not to mention more than 190 species of birds.

DAYS 24-25 HARRISON HOT SPRINGS

Make sure you visit the Bridal Veil Falls Provincial Park where the 60 metre falls cascade down a smooth rock face, creating a watery veil. At Harrison Hot Springs you'll find plenty to do. The lake is fringed with delightful beaches, you can take a boat out or trek into the surrounding mountains. And, of course, you can soak away any aches and pains in the mineral rich hot springs.

DAYS 26-27 VANCOUVER

Say goodbye to the epic natural wilderness of Canada's interior. You will have a last chance to see the sights of Vancouver. On day 27 hand back your motorhome at the depot and transfer to the airport. The end of a truly memorable journey.

Explore craggy inlets, idyllic harbours and white sand beaches while enjoying some of the finest lobster & seafood around. Step back in time in this pioneer country while immersing yourself in this pristine environment.

DAYS 1-2 ARRIVE HALIFAX

Halifax is tiny compared to Vancouver and Toronto but has plenty of charm with its heritage buildings, attractive parks and the distinctive hilltop citadel, a star-shaped fort that was completed in the 1950s.

DAY 3 PEGGY'S COVE

Collect your motorhome and take the Lighthouse Route along to Peggy's Cove on St Margaret's Bay where the jaunty white-with-a-red-cap lighthouse stands resolute on a granite cliff.

DAYS 4-5 LUNENBURG

Today is a day for cruising along the scenic Lighthouse Route passing sandy beaches and gazing out to beautiful bays sprinkled with picturesque islands. The craggy coastline shelters little fishing villages like Mahone Bay with its jaunty Victorian buildings. The Nova Scotia fishing port of Lunenburg is a must-see stop off point on the South Shore.

DAY 6-7 GRANVILLE FERRY

Cross the LaHave River heading toward Kejimkujik National Park, a vast area of pristine wilderness in the heart of Nova Scotia, with lush forests, island dotted lakes and meandering rivers.

DAY 8 GRAND PRÉ

Travel up to Hall's Harbour on the Bay of Fundy, a picturesque natural harbour with one of the world's highest tides. It's also an amazing place to enjoy the seaside atmosphere of a lobster fishing port and, yes, to tuck into amazing lobster. The Grand Pré National Historic Site is a UNESCO World Heritage site, celebrated as a centre where you can learn about the Acadian people.

DAY 9 FIVE ISLANDS

Drive around the Minas Basin on the Bay of Fundy to Five Island Provincial Park. With 300ft high cliffs rising majestically from the rocky shores, and some of the world's highest tides, a dramatic backdrop is assured for your stay here.

DAYS 10-11 FUNDY NATIONAL PARK

Head along the gorgeous beaches and lighthouse of Parrsboro and on to Joggins Fossil Cliffs, another UNESCO World Heritage Site, where the cliffs preserve some of the world's most important fossils. Fundy National Park offers hiking trails to suit all abilities, with some following the shoreline and others threading through the ancient forests or to stunning, secluded waterfalls.

DAYS 12-13 PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

Start today with a visit to Hopewell Rocks, a great place to explore during low tide. Then cross Confederation Bridge to Canada's smallest and least populated province, Prince Edward Island. Charlotteville is the picturesque provincial capital, with an attractive blend of leafy streets, colourful houses and bustling boardwalks.

DAY 14 PICTOU

Take the morning at your leisure and explore Prince Edward Island before catching the ferry to Pictou, Nova Scotia in the afternoon. There you can stroll along the historic waterfront, admire the original Scottish architecture, the wild beaches, excellent trails, browse the museums and be tempted by the seafood restaurants.

DAY 15 CHÉTICAMP

Follow the Ceilidh Trail, a scenic trail which snakes along the west coast of Cape Breton Island providing stunning views across the Gulf of St. Lawrence. The trail ends in Margaree Harbour where it meets the Cabot Trail, an epic road that loops and dives around the north of Cape Breton.

It's a good day to enjoy the local wildlife in its spectacular natural habitat. Take a ferry trip to Bird Islands where you can see puffins and various sea birds, as well as seals and bald eagles.

DAY 19 LOUISBOURG

Louisbourg is a remote spot out on the coast. The main draw here, apart from the sheer unspoilt scenery, is the Fortress of Louisbourg, a National Historic Site. This living museum is the largest historical reconstruction in North America of a 1700s French garrison town.

DAY 20 SHERBROOKE

Head along the south shore of Bras d'Or Lake, pausing to visit St. Peter's Canal Historic Site. Here you can discover how the canal has linked the Atlantic Ocean and the Bras d'Or Lake for over 140 years. This region of Nova Scotia is wonderfully untamed, a nature lover's paradise with miles of hiking trails and lots of wildlife.

DAY 21 DARTMOUTH

The shoreline is distinctive for the wildness of its coastline, with working fishing ports and endless ribbons of spotless beach stretching to the horizon. Perhaps relax with an al fresco picnic at Marie Joseph Provincial Park or unwind with a stroll along the 3 mile white sand beach of Martinique Beach Provincial Park.

DAY 22 DEPART HALIFAX



These are largely undeveloped areas of Crown land that are generally located well off the main roads, often down bumpy tracks next to rivers and lakes and don't tend to come with many (if any) facilities. Non-Canadian citizens may require a permit or pay a small fee to freecamp. Staying on private land or overnighting in rest stops is not permitted.

DAYS 1-3 ARRIVE NEW YORK

Located in one of the largest natural harbours in the world, New York is truly the city that never sleeps. On arrival you will be met and transferred to your centrally located hotel where you will spend the next three nights. New York is bursting with places to visit and things to do, from museums to monuments and everything in between. Why not catch a show on Broadway or head up the Empire State building for stunning views across the city.

DAYS 4-5 PRESTON

DAYS 12-13 BAR HARBOUR

Make your way along the coastline of Maine as you head to your next destination. Bar Harbour is located on Mt Desert Island which is surrounded by the cliffs and seascapes of the Acadia National Park. The state of Maine is best known for its dramatic and scenic coastline so make sure you allow plenty of time for exploring.

DAYS 14-15 MOUNT BLUE STATE PARK

Head inland to Maine's capital of Bangor and then continue your drive through the state's picturesque interior to the Mount Blue State Park, which is home to moose, red squirrels and the more elusive black bear and coyote. Places you might like to visit include the picturesque Webb Beach and nearby Center Hill.

DAYS 16-18 BETHLEHEM

Continue your journey into New Hampshire and the White Mountain National Forest where the mountains get higher and where Mount Washington, at 6,288 feet, dominates the skyline. A visit to the summit of Mount Washington on the 1869 coal-fired cog railway is highly recommended. The mountains and forest offer wonderful scenery with clear mountain lakes and walking and hiking trails for you to enjoy.

DAYS 19-20 GIFFORD WOODS

Today you will leave New Hampshire and cross into Vermont and as you head to the year round resort surrounding Killington Peak. You could make a stop in Hanover to visit the world famous Dartmouth College, one of the nine colonial colleges chartered before the American Revolution.

DAYS 21-22 ARLINGTON



You can see his paintings at the Norman Rockwell Exhibition which is close by.

Today's journey takes you back into New York State as you head south following the Hudson River eventually bringing you out at Hyde Park, the birthplace and home of Franklin D Roosevelt and where both he and wife Eleanor are buried.

DAY 25 DEPART NEW YORK

This morning make the short journey back to Newark to return your RV before transferring to the airport for your onward journey. Or perhaps extend your stay with a few more nights in New York City to fully explore and enjoy everything it has to offer.



DAYS 1-2 ARRIVE ANCHORAGE

On arrival you will be met and transferred to your centrally located hotel where you will spend the next two nights. Anchorage is the largest city in Alaska and as well as being the gateway to the surrounding wilderness is also the states cultural centre, with attractions including the Native Heritage Centre, art galleries and music. Explore the city at your leisure and enjoy the sea views on one side and the mountains rising up on the other.

DAYS 3-4 PALMER

Pick up your motorhome and head northeast on the Glenn Highway through the townships of Eagle River and Chugiak towards Palmer. As you head through the Eklutna Flats you will be able to see the towering vistas of the Chugach and Talkeetna Mountains and catch a glimpse of Pioneer Peak in the distance. If you would like closer view of Knick Glacier, then you could take an airboat tour which operates about 20 miles from Palmer.

DAYS 5-6 DENALI NATIONAL PARK

Today you'll drive through the Matanuska-Susitna Valley and Denali National Park. Denali is six million acres of wilderness, bisected by one ribbon of road and as you travel along it, you may catch a glimpse of some incredible wildlife as you pass through lush forests framed by alpine tundra and snowy mountain peaks. It is also home to North America's tallest peak, Mount McKinley/ Denali at 20,320ft (6,914m).

DAYS 7-8 FAIRBANKS

Continue your journey along the Parks Highway with its incredible forest and mountain landscapes to Fairbanks. Drive through the communities of Healy, Nenana and by the community of Ester, an old gold mining camp. Once in Fairbanks we recommend a wildlife tour where you may see bears, caribou, moose, wolves and a variety of birds.

DAYS 9-10 PAXSON, GLENNALLEN

As you leave Fairbanks you may want to make a stop at the North Pole, the home of North America's Santa Claus, before following the Richardson Highway to Delta Junction. From here continue your journey south towards Paxson and Glennallen, where you can enjoy a range of outdoor activities from world-class salmon fishing in the Copper River to hiking, rafting and even flightseeing.

DAYS 11-12 VALDEZ

Enjoy a spectacular drive on the Richardson Highway where part of the route runs parallels with the Trans-Alaska Pipeline and where if the weather permits, you can enjoy some incredible views of the Wrangell Mountains. Continue to Worthington Glacier, which can be seen from the road, but is well worth a stop. Then continue along the highway through Keystone Canyon with its waterfalls cascading down the slopes on either side of the road. Day 12 is free for you to explore Valdez, a must see on any Alaskan itinerary, with its numerous glaciers tumbling down from the towering Chugach mountains that rise straight up out of the sea.

DAYS 13-14 SEWARD

This morning board the Alaska Marine Highway Ferry to Whittier and travel across the beautiful Prince William Sound. The ferry affords stunning views of the sound and we recommend spending the crossing out on the deck, giving you the best chance of seeing the whales, seals and otters who frequent the sound. On arrival in Whittier continue via the Seward Highway with its scenic landscapes to Seward. Portage Glacier and the Begich, Boggs Visitor Centre are interesting stops with exhibits that let visitors walk through a simulated ice cave, view live ice worms or touch an iceberg. For those seeking a closer look at Portage Glacier, there are hour-long sightseeing boat cruises on Portage Lake, or you can hike a number of foot trails that take you near the frozen monument.

DAY 15 ANCHORAGE

Re-join the Seward Highway and head towards Anchorage but, before you do, make sure that you visit Kenai Fjords National Park. Over 30 glaciers flow from the icefield down into the fjords and your options to explore the park include hikes, kayaking and boat trips out in the fjord.

DAY 16 DEPART ANCHORAGE

This morning make the short journey back to the motorhome depot to return your motorhome before transferring to the airport for your onward journey.



Vehicles drive on the left as they do here in Australia & New Zealand, and speed limits and distances are indicated in kilometres. Other Southern African roads are more varied, especially in Namibia, where you will find more dusty and bumpy gravel tracks along with tarred roads. Be sure to take animal warning signs seriously as wildlife does wander onto the roadways and can cause significant problems.

We also recommend a visit to the UNESCO World Heritage Centre of Twyfelfontein, where you can view the ancient rock engravings left by ancient tribes.

DAYS 10-11 PALMWAG & DAMARALAND

Palmwag offers a number of optional excursions including Rhino tracking or an excursion to seek out the wildlife of Damaraland, where you may see desert elephants, black rhino, gemsbok (oryx), kudu, springbok and, if you're lucky, lion and cheetah.

DAYS 12-14 ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK

Head northwards today as you and make your way to Etosha National Park, perhaps making a stop en route at an authentic Himba village. Etosha is unique in Africa, the park's main feature is a salt pan so large it can be seen from space, yet there is abundant wildlife that congregates around the waterholes, giving you almost guaranteed sightings. As the sun goes down, Etosha comes into its own due to the gently floodlit watering holes on the edges of the campsites that allow the animals to drink unhindered, whilst affording you with a spectacular view. DAYS 1-2 JOHANNESBURG

Arrival in Johannesburg and transfer to your hotel for two nights. Nelson Mandela Square is close by or ask us to arrange a tour, perhaps to Soweto township. Day 2 includes a motorhome familiarisation session, so you can hit the road with confidence the next day, before a group welcome dinner that evening.

DAYS 3-4 SABIE

Today's destination is Sabie, allowing you to enjoy the stunning Panorama Route, one of the country's most thrilling scenic drives. When should I book?

The popularity of 'motorhoming' has never been so high. For tailor-made holidays, early booking is highly recommended to avoid disappointment. Many rental companies have adopted a dynamic pricing policy meaning prices rise as demand increases, so you should expect to get the best deals by booking well in advance. This also means you will have a greater choice of vehicles and be able to secure your preferred travel dates.

When is the best time to travel?

The most popular time to travel is in the peak summer months of the destination you are travelling to. You will generally get cheaper rates if you travel outside of the high season. Roads are generally less crowded and the demand for campsites is less busy.

What insurance do I need to take out?

In addition to your travel insurance, you will need to take out insurance to cover damage to the motorhome in the event of an accident. Standard vehicle insurance is usually included in the daily hire rate, but the excess payable is often substantial. Most companies offer different liability reduction options and we suggest you consider purchasing these to reduce your excess amount to the minimum.

How long should I allow for my holiday?

Many people make the mistake of underestimating the distances involved in destinations such as USA, Canada, Europe and Australia. Similarly, road conditions in smaller nations like New Zealand and the UK can make for a slower travel time. If you have time constraints, you may be better focusing on certain states or regions and consider returning at another time to continue exploring those places you have yet to visit. Speak to one of our team members who can suggest tried and tested itineraries so that you get the most out of your holiday in the time you have available.

Are one-way rentals available?

Yes one-way rentals are available and a number of the holidays featured in this brochure include them. They are often subject to a one-way rental fee as the motorhome hire company will need to return the vehicle to its original depot. Our knowledgeable team will be happy to provide details and discuss your options with you.

I've never driven a motorhome before, is that a problem?

Certainly not! For many of our clients, this will be their first motorhome holiday. A full, one-to-one instruction will be provided at the collection of your vehicle, allowing you plenty of time to familiarise yourself with the controls and ask questions.

Can I use my ordinary drivers' license?

It's possible for anyone aged over the age of 21 years to rent the vehicles offered in this brochure using an ordinary full Australian or New Zealand driving licence. This includes the larger American 'A' class RVs. An International Driving Permit (IDP) is a legal requirement for some parts of Europe and whilst not mandatory, we do advise carrying an IDP if travelling to America, Canada and South Africa.

How old do I have to be to drive a motorhome?

The minimum age requirement in most countries is 21 years old. The upper age limit varies from country to country and is determined by the rental company. For example, in Europe and the UK, the upper age limit ranges from 76-80 years whilst there is no upper age limit in either New Zealand or Australia. Ask our team to confirm any age limits based on your travel destination.

Do we have to travel in convoy on an escorted tour?

The answer is no in all destinations, except for the Tale of Three Countries tour in Southern Africa where 4x4 motorhomes are used. The roads on this tour can be challenging in certain areas (hence the need for a 4x4) and we have a back-up vehicle with a mechanic onboard that travels at the rear of the group to help you in the event of a puncture or mechanical breakdown. However, on non-travelling days where you are spending consecutive nights at the same campsite you will be free to explore as you please.

Do I need to prebook campsites and ferries?

Prebooking campsites and ferries is definitely recommended in peak travel months. If you travel out of season, it is not always necessary to prebook these. If we are unable to make specific campsite bookings for you, we will supply you with information on where and how to book campsites.

Is the motorhome fully equipped?

The majority of motorhomes come fully equipped with kitchen utensils, linen and bedding. Depending on the package you book, it may also come with Sat Nav or GPS and camping table and chairs.

Is there room to store my luggage?

We recommend that you take soft bags and suitcases rather than rigid ones if possible. They are much easier to store in the motorhome as storage space can be limited although some vehicles do come with a large 'garage'. Some rental companies will allow you to leave luggage at their depot providing you are returning to the same location, whist others do offer a forwarding service (subject to charge).

What happens if we breakdown?

Breakdown cover is included in all rentals and you will be provided with a 24/7 emergency telephone contact number that you should call. Depending on the nature of the problem, someone will be sent out to assist you or you may be asked to carry on to the next major town and arrange for the repairs to be done there.

What is a security deposit?

Most companies will ask you to leave a security deposit against damage to the motorhome, often equal to the amount of the insurance excess. This is usually paid by credit card, with some companies processing the transaction which results in monies debited from your account and then refunded at the end of your hire. Others may simply take an imprint of your card. Your security deposit may also be used to pay any fess charged by the rental company for returning the vehicle in an unclean state or by failing to empty all the grey and black water tanks or cassettes.

Do you work with all motorhome rental companies?

We have carefully selected our rental partners in all the countries we offer, to ensure that vehicle safety, maintenance and quality is of the highest standard. We can provide a wide range of vehicle types in terms of both price and size for each destination, but we also work with a number of other companies who are not featured in this brochure. Ask for details from one of our travel specialists.
